260,000 **KIWI KIDS** **LIVE IN POVERTY** THAT'S **1 IN 4** **CHILDREN***

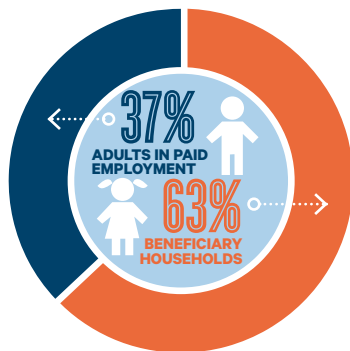
THEIR LIVE OFF LESS THAN **FAMILIES** **60%** OF NZ'S **median income**

INCOME IS AFTER HOUSING COSTS AS THIS IS A SIGNIFICANT AND FIXED PORTION OF HOUSEHOLD SPENDING. IT SHOWS WHAT IS LEFT FOR OTHER ESSENTIALS.

CHILDREN ARE MORE THAN TWICE AS LIKELY TO BE IN POVERTY THAN THOSE AGED 65+

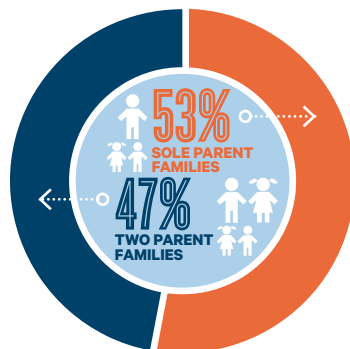
